

**RULES & REGULATIONS  
OF THE KAPOHO KAI WATER ASSOCIATION**

- 1. Water meter installation fee is \$5,500. A monthly administration charge of \$9 is charged all subscribers for meter reading, standby charges, line loss, accounting, legal fees, insurance, tax filings, annual meeting expenses, office and equipment supplies, and other fixed expenses.**
- 2. No lot shall have more than a single 5/8" meter.**
- 3. No Subscriber shall sell or donate water to anyone without the prior written consent of the Board of Directors of the Association.**
- 4. Any costs of repair to the common line for damage caused by the Subscriber or by agents or contractors of the Subscriber, arising out of or related to the Subscriber's use of the lot shall be the responsibility of the Subscriber. Only persons authorized by the County of Hawaii may perform work on the common line except in case of emergency.**
- 5. A Subscriber is obligated to promptly repair leaks, or correct any problem within the Subscriber's property, which may cause excessive water consumption and may adversely affect the other subscribers by e.g. reduced flow rate or pressure, and the Subscriber shall be solely responsible for the lost water costs.**
- 6. Any and all unauthorized connections to the common line or private lines shall be immediately removed, and may be subject to a penalty.**
- 7. Failure to correct a violation within five (5) business days of receipt of written notice from the Association shall result in disconnection of service. The Association has the right to seek an injunction or other relief against the continued violation of the terms and conditions of this Application, and the Subscriber will be responsible for all expenses including reasonable attorneys fees and court costs, suffered or incurred by the Association as a result of the violation or in enforcing the terms and conditions of this Application.**
- 14. All equipment including pipes, valves, meters, regulators, etc. running from the common line to the house meter is the property of the Association, and will be the responsibility of the Association. If a meter breaks, the Association will replace it at Association expense. After the house meter all of the equipment is the property of the Subscriber and the responsibility of the Subscriber. The agents of the Association may be hired on an individual basis to do Subscriber's repairs with no affiliation or liability to the Association.**
- 15. In the event of dissolution under Article XII of the KKWA Bi-Laws, the terms "in proportion to the amount of business done by the members during that period" is interpreted to mean "number of subscriptions".**
- 16. There shall be a separate meter for each lot receiving water.**
